Team Oregon Rider Skills Practice (RSP) April 19, 2015

BMWRO members who'd like to take the RSP should call 800-545-9944 identify yourself as a BMWRO member and sign up for the class. You will need to tell the representative it's for the Eugene RSP class on April 19.

This course will *ONLY* be open to BMWRO members. We already have 3 participants lined up. Once we reach 12 participants the registration will close.

The cost will be \$99.00 / participant. Here is a link to the RSP class that will give background information. http:// team-oregon.org/training/riderskillspractice/

Secondly, the session will run from 1:00 PM until 5:30 PM rain or shine (sorry, no refunds for no shows).

All participant motorcycles must be in a good state of repair and operating condition. This class is noncompetitive. It simply is a chance to practice old skills that may have escaped us, or capture new skills to make us safer, more aware motorcyclists. It's a great opportunity to practice in a safe environment under the watchful eyes of trained instructors.

Our member, Bob Metzger, is scheduled to be one of the instructors for the session and has arranged this RSP class exclusively for BMWRO.

Some insurance companies will lower your rate for taking this class.

The course outline is as follows:

An introductory circuit ride. The circuit ride is meant to establish base line skills of each rider for:

- 1) head and eve position,
- 2) low speed / tight -quarter maneuvers,
- 3) cornering,
- 4) swerving, and
- 5) maximum in-line braking.

The course will cover

Unit 1 Mental Motorcycling

Unit 2 Cornering with Confidence

Unit 3 Stopping Quickly and Safely

Unit 4 Swerving

Unit 5 Street Wise

Unit 6 Impairments to Safety

Unit 7 Group Riding

Unit 8 Carrying Passengers & Cargo

Following the above units, each rider will re-ride the circuit and will be amazed at how much they have improved!

Upon completion, each rider will receive a certificate of completion, a 30 page spiral bound booklet, and a graduation pack with some Team Oregon goodies!

NW Ambassadors Ride Report January 2015

As I steadied myself for a cold journey to work on Friday, January 2nd, I noted the temperature was 23 degrees. "Tomorrow at this time I am going to have to leave the house for the First Saturday ride," I thought to myself. "Why?" I alternated between calling and emailing David at least a dozen times during the day to ask him, "How safe is this?" and "Should we be doing this at all?" But I resisted. When I awoke Saturday, the temperature had risen to a balmy 37 degrees and it had rained over night. I was...relieved?

At Tigard BMW, an optimistic and adventuresome crowd was gathering. It was clear from chatter like the roads are fine, it's chilly but above freezing, and this is great that there was no stopping this group. So up we saddled: 13 riders. 12 bikes in all. **David** and

Diane Peterson led, followed by (in no particular order), Kim Dorsing & Janice Mathern, John Vissell, Mike Ripley, newcomer Wayne Lincoln, Ric Holderbaum, Frank Boyle, René Renteria, and Susan Ortiz-Renteria. Greg Straub insisted on sweeping, arguing persuasively that his day-glo red jacket would provide important contrast in a sea of day-glo yellow – and he was right.

Riding this time of year is a valley floor affair. But our destination, Sauvie Island, was on the north side of Portland's West Hills – and David hoped a quick scamper out Bethany Road and over Newberry Road to the north would be no problem. But that was before it rained overnight. And with a climb to 850 feet, wet roads, and temps still in the 30s, David had





visions of twisted plastic and personal injury lawyers dancing in his head. So we stayed in the flats, winding through Portland, around the West Hills.

Taking the low road was a little shorter – and much quicker – than taking the hill route. As we crossed the Sauvie Island Bridge, my mind floated back to December 2007. The Vernonia flood¹ and Woodson debris flow² had just happened and ODOT was in the midst of getting highways open again. Compounding the storm runoff, marine traffic on the Columbia River was restricted to allow the superstructure of the new Sauvie Island Bridge to be floated into place. Seeing the superstructure being floated is something I will never forget. Now we were riding over it. Truly a stirring moment for this ODOT engineer.

Sauvie Island is the largest island along the Columbia River. Wikipedia describes it as one of the largest river islands in the United States³. Predominantly farmland and wildlife refuge, it extends north into the Columbia at its confluence with the Willamette.

Roads on the island consist of a 15-mile loop at the island's south end, with three separate fingers extending north. One, Reeder Road, extends north about 9 miles from the loop, along the Columbia River. A second, Oak Island Road, extends about 4 miles north to Sturgeon Lake, in the middle of the island. A third, Sauvie Island Road, extends 7 miles north along the west side of the island, along the waterway that separates the island from the mainland, known as the Multnomah Channel.

Our ride took us counter-clockwise around the loop, along Gillihan Road, then north up the Reeder Road finger. About 5 miles out, the pavement ended; we would have to save our visit to Sauvie Island's famous nude beach for another day! But there was still plenty of entertainment – flocks of flying geese, ducks, and hundreds of grub-foraging sandhill cranes. At the end of our Audubon moment, David announced that if the chill had taken its toll, we could cut the ride short and head for lunch. "Let's ride!" was the united response.

After an uninspired side trip up the island's middle finger (there's an interesting turn of phrase), we skipped the third finger and left the island. Approaching Scappoose, we headed toward the river again, along aptly-named Dike Road. Along the way we encountered a statuesque Texas Longhorn – so humongous that some questioned whether it was real or not. We later agreed that it was and that the horns were as massive as any of us had ever seen.

The dining choices in Scappoose are limited, but Ichabod's got the nod. And they rose to the occasion, carving out a table for 15 (even though they don't take reservations) and offering us a full menu of delicious food, including Diane's favorite menu notice: Breakfast served all day. Why a table of 15 for a group of 13, you ask? Because just as we sat down Scot & Carol Lamper rolled into the lot! We were now 15 adventurous souls! Coffee, hot chocolate, and chili arrived almost without our having to ask.



As we prepared to depart, Mike Ripley noticed his final drive was coated with oil, an observation that is rarely associated with a positive outcome. Considering he had just returned from a Christmas week lap around northern California, he was lucky to experience it only now and it was incredible that he made it home safely. That's it – from now on, he's the Incredible Mr. Ripley!

It's been 12 straight months of First Saturday rides. We'll see if we can keep our monthly streak alive. You're all invited to join us February 7th for our next First Saturday adventure. Where, you ask? We'll see where the weather takes us...
