Registration through the 1st—by which time, you will be able June 15th. Fees will be \$55.00 for to order rally T-shirts and sign up for your choice of Team Oregon classes.

On-line registration will be open from March 1st through members and \$70.00 for nonmembers and will include dinner tickets for both Friday and Saturday.

Gate Registration does not include the dinners:

Registration at the gate will be \$45.00 for members and \$60.00 for non-members. A limited number of meal tickets will be available for purchase at the gate for \$15.00/

meal —thirty meal tickets per night, five of which are vegetarian. available for gate registrants and for vendors. Vendors are being told that they are welcome to purchase

meal tickets. According to David Morganstern, most vendors will choose to purchase at least the Saturday dinner ticket in order to be present during the major door prize drawings.

The Dinners:

After extended socialization, bench riding, map reviews and ride plotting over a salad and delicious meal that offered us many strawberry lemonades and Pepsi's, the meeting was called to order at 1:20 pm by **BMWRO club President, Alice LeBarron**. She thanked Debra Hughes-Habel and Bill Habel for so graciously organizing and coordinating this first quarterly meeting of 2019; and then it was on to generous thanks to those who'd registered to attend the luncheon. Each member had the opportunity to introduce themselves. A few interesting tidbits were shared including a tmembership since 1990 (Roger Paquette), Joe Collins who still has the F650GS he once won at a National Rally, and Sam Olsen, the original founder of the club!

There were 36 Members in attendance. Executive Committee members in attendance were President Alice LeBarron, Vice President Chris Henry, and Secretary Linnea Alvord. Webmaster Stacy Brock and Treasurer Nate Levin were both unable to attend.

Treasurer's Report

Organized rides out of the Rally are being planned more than ever before:

- Dualsport and Road rides
- Ride leaders and sweeps are needed!
- We are trying to have 3-4 rides per day.
- Lots of maps are being planned to be available at the Information booth.

A little on the costs you're going to see. The Fairgrounds raised their rates from \$2200 that we were charged in 2018. Alice negotiated heavily and they graciously gave us a final rate of \$4000 for our event. We've translated that into the following event fees for the three nights of camping and meal options:

- \$55.00 Early Registration BMWRO Member, meals included
- \$45.00 Gate registration, BMWRO Member, no meals included
- \$70.00 Early Registration non-member, meals included
- \$60.00 Gate Registration non-member, no meals included

We had a lot of feedback about the meals, can you believe it? As such, the catering plan has been reviewed, analyzed and arrived at some changes! Snaffle Bit will be providing Friday night's fowl-based meal, and Friends of the Fair will handle some meatier options for Saturday night. A new vendor will manage the breakfast option and be prepared for real-time purchases from 150 hungry mouths on Friday and 200 Saturday.

For folks that can't pre-register for the Rally, and turn up at the gate to register, the club doesn't want those folks to go hungry either! So this year, we will underwrite a portion of extra meals: each night 30 extra meals will be available, of which 5 will be vegetarian.

According to some folks, they do NOT actually go to the rally for the food though! So to accommodate their wishes, a danceable Blues band has been locked down for Friday night. This group from Bend promises to get even the least flexible feet tapping.



- The Executive Committee proposes to align with a simplified paradigm which maintains a single member type. As a social club we value guests and non-members at our events and they will continue to always be welcome to events. A vote will be initiated to amend member types.






